

How Prairie Band Casino & Resort is Building More Ways to Play

The Prairie Band Potawatomi Nation has owned Prairie Band Casino & Resort in Mayetta, Kansas, for 20 years. As guests to the casino and the Firekeeper Golf Course can see, the management has made frequent improvements to the facilities over the years, including the recent addition of a full-scale bingo hall.

The newly updated gaming floor features ambient lighting that accentuates the casino's wide selection of slots and table games by incorporating the fire motif found throughout the resort.

The resort's latest project, a two-year renovation and expansion to the current facilities, reinforces the tribe's promise to its guests: that Prairie Band Casino & Resort gives you more ways to play whether you enjoy gaming, live concerts, golf, fine dining or a night away.

Earlier this year the first phase of construction began with aesthetic updates to the casino gaming floor and two welcome additions to the hotel lobby, the Kapi Coffee Bar and Lobby Bar. Kapi, the Potawatomi word for "coffee," offers guests selections to rival those of a traditional coffee shop with a full-service espresso bar, iced coffee, smoothies, fresh-squeezed juices and bottled beverages. Pair your latte with a fresh pastry or handcrafted sandwich. Gluten-free and low-carb options are available.

The Lobby Bar fulfills a need heretofore lacking in the Prairie Band Casino lobby. It's meeting friends, companions and colleagues after a day of golf or before a night of exciting entertainment. Take a seat at the bar and enjoy locally brewed beers, signature cocktails and a snack from the ample Bar Bites menu.

The Buffalo Grill, just steps from the casino floor offers a menu of handmade burgers, oven-baked pizza and crafted-to-order sandwiches.

Disruptions to guests and daily operations have been minimal and management anticipates this to continue through the second phase of construction. In the second phase, scheduled to begin in 2019, the resort will add a new building to house an additional 75 hotel rooms and suites, as well as 500 spaces of covered parking, a luxurious spa and fitness center, indoor and outdoor pools, hot tubs, and meeting areas.

If guests already think of Prairie Band Casino & Resort as a state-of-the-art gaming and entertainment destination in the state, they haven't seen anything yet.
