CASA - SHAWNEE COUNTY

CASA of Shawnee County is a 501 (c) 3, private, not-for-profit that was incorporated in 1986. CASA recruits, trains and supports Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) community volunteers who assist the juvenile court in protecting the interests of abused and neglected children in Shawnee County. Once appointed by a juvenile court judge, our CASA volunteers begin a process of information gathering with the goal of guiding abused children out of the foster care system, identifying the child's needs, and ensuring rehabilitative services are being provided.

They act as a communication link between the complicated pieces of the child welfare system and the court. Volunteers gather all of the pertinent information about their child's case and make recommendations to the judge based on that information. Judges have noted the value of information that CASA brings to the proceedings and national studies show that a child who has been assigned a CASA volunteer spends less time in court and less time in foster care than those who have no CASA representation.
